Transformative Journey to Success

Two certificates hanging in the office of Carlos Alberto Mosqueira Pérez, CEO of the Grupo Diagnóstico Proa, are a source of great pride. They aren't his university degrees, but something just as valuable: Recognition of Carpermor laboratories being CAP-accredited—the first Mexican-owned laboratories to earn and maintain this distinction for 22 years.

This achievement, like so many others, began with a vision—one that had its roots back in 1948, when Mosqueira's grandfather was inspired to improve health care in Mexico. When Carpermor was established in 1993 to attract business-to-business (B2B) opportunities while bringing modern, quality diagnostic testing to the country, CAP accreditation was a key objective in its pursuit of laboratory excellence. Earning accreditation from the CAP in 2004 helped position the organization among Mexico's leading reference laboratory companies. More than two decades later, those certificates are reminders of how far the organization has come—and signposts for the journey that lies ahead.

BACKGROUND

Differentiating in a Very Crowded Market

Mexico's clinical laboratory service market has over 18,300 registered medical and diagnostic laboratories. Physicians are required to give patients a choice of three labs for testing, and the patient is responsible for getting the needed tests done and the results back to their doctor. With so many labs available—and with only 10% of the Mexican population having medical insurance—how do referring physicians and patients make the best choice?

Carpermor, the second-largest clinical lab company in Mexico, has found the answer: Differentiation through a patient-centered focus—and through its decades-long relationship with the College of American Pathologists (CAP) and its global accreditation program.

APPROACH

Pursuing Excellence, Standardizing Quality

Recognizing that it's the customer—referring partners and patients—who decides where to go for diagnostic tests, Carpermor focused on being the first and best choice. To ensure access and make testing convenient for patients, its parent company built a network of more than 700 collection centers throughout Mexico known as Chopo. To maintain quality and accuracy, patient samples are sent to the 23 Carpermor reference labs, with the two CAP-accredited locations providing the most comprehensive testing capabilities.

Carpermor has been relentless in its pursuit of excellence. In 2001, it earned ISO 9000 accreditation for quality management systems, followed by ISO 15189 in 2003 for quality and competence in medical laboratories. In 2004, it became the first Mexican-owned laboratory services company to earn CAP accreditation, the global standard of quality for medical laboratories. "No one pushed us to do this," says Luz Maria Karg Barroso, Carpermor's director of Corporate Quality and Operational Excellence. "We were pioneers."

The CAP provided the guidance, systems, and benchmarking that enabled Carpermor to earn the trust and patronage of locals, visitors, businesses, and health care partners. The CAP also helped in standardizing quality processes and creating market differentiation, making Carpermor a powerful brand in Mexico and positioning them for growth beyond their borders.

CONCLUSION

Opportunities in Mexico and Beyond

CEO Mosqueira is not shy about crediting the CAP with much of Carpermor's success. "Accreditation is not required, but we're conscious that we're working on what's most valuable to all our patients, which is their health. This is what really inspired us to pursue CAP accreditation." The CAP has also helped Carpermor expand their business with hospitals, global manufacturing corporations, and pharmaceutical companies—positioning them well to reach other markets. "We see strong growth opportunities along the US-Mexico border, as well as in medical tourism and the ex-pat community. CAP accreditation helps patients identify trusted, high-quality care and serves as a valuable differentiator that justifies the investment."
